The 6th annual Hororata Highland Games, held on the 5th November, attracted a huge crowd of over 10,000 people. Entertaining them were nearly 100 Highland Dancers, 11 Pipe Bands, 54 Solo Pipers and Drummers and 12 Tug O' War teams. Four teams spun their way to glory in the Highland Spin, 16 school teams competed in the Junior Warriors, 19 people took aim at the Small Bore Shooting Championship and 20 men and women athletes tossed, threw and strained as they contested the heavy championships.

Over 1,000 people had a go at tossing a Caber, Sheaf and Haggis as well as trying Archery, Small Bore Shooting, the Farmers Walk, Mini Digger Challenge and much more. The Bike Polo, Duncan Cotterill stage performers, SCA, Scottish and Irish dancers, Scottish Backhold wrestling and the Scottish Clans provided amazing entertainment and colour throughout the day. 
