

The 7th annual Hororata Highland Games has again seen our rural community stage a superb event enjoyed by 11,000 people. All competitions were well subscribed this year with 12 Pipe Bands, 106 Highland Dancers (officially the biggest one-day competition in New Zealand), 58 solo pipers and drummers, 18 wool spinners, 140 tuggers, 68 Junior Warriors, 6 shooters and 20 heavy athletes competing. Each of these competitions is an event in themselves, surround that with the Have A Go activities, entertainment and stalls this is one complex event!

The Hororata Domain is a wonderful venue which we are so proud and fortunate to have in our community. This year, prior to the event we spent considerable time and resource developing and investing in the Hororata Domain to improve entry and exits for cars and the general flow of people around the venue. WHAT DOES ALL THIS MEAN FOR THE COMMUNITY?

Through funds raised at the Hororata Highland Games in 2016, the Hororata Community Trust invested \$20,000.00 back into the community. The rest has been invested awaiting a decision around our community's cornerstone project.

In February 2017, after public consultation, community groups united to discuss ideas for Hororata's public spaces and facilities. This group includes representatives from all key Domain and Hall users including the Hororata Reserve Committee, Citizen's Committee, Tennis Club, Scouts, Rifle Club, Playcentre and Hororata Community Trust.

Called 'Go Hororata' the group's mission is to work collaboratively to develop a concept plan for public facilities needed in Hororata now, and into the future.

In June 2017 Go Hororata commissioned a feasibility study into the development of a new community centre. This study was funded by the Hororata Community Trust and has been presented to the Selwyn District Council for a new facility to be included in the 10-year plan.

Watch this space! Thanks to the Hororata Highland Games big things are possible for our community.
